

## ***Professor Ole Wæver – University of Copenhagen***



Ole Wæver is Professor of International Relations in the Department of Political Science, University of Copenhagen, and director of CAST, Centre for Advanced Security Theory. He primarily researches in security theory, regional security analysis and the history and sociology of the disciplines of International Relations and Security/Strategic Studies. Most influential is probably his creation of the theory of ‘securitization’ (as part of what is known as the Copenhagen School in security studies). With this theory, he is currently analysing mostly securitization in the two fields of religion and climate change.

He was elected member in 2007 of the Royal Danish Academy of Sciences and Letters of 1742. His books include (co-authored with Barry Buzan and others) *Identity, Migration and the New Security Agenda in Europe* (Pinter 1993); *Security: A New Framework for Analysis* (Lynne Rienner 1998); *Regions and Powers: The Structure of International Security* (Cambridge University Press 2003) and (co-ed with Arlene B. Tickner) *International Relations Scholarship around the World* (Routledge 2009).
